In this public forum, Ume Wainetti will explore the gains made, the promising approaches, and the challenges ahead for an effective response to gender-based violence in PNG. In particular, she will argue for the critical need to fill the missing

gap in case management to ensure that survivors in PNG have a better chance of getting the services and support they need.
